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THE CHALLENGE: SOIL IS "JUST DIRT"

Soil biodiversity is rarely understood by the public. For many citizens, soil is simply "just dirt" – something to walk on, not a living, breathing ecosystem essential to life. This lack of awareness limits public engagement in soil protection and undermines efforts to address environmental challenges.

The Basque Soil Living Lab, coordinated by GAIA and its partners, identified **soil literacy as a priority for action**, seeking innovative ways to help people see soil differently.

SOIL LITERACY COMBINES BROAD AWARENESS WITH SPECIALISED UNDERSTANDING, ACROSS A RANGE OF DISCIPLINES, THROUGH COMMUNICATION AND EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES THAT BRING SOIL CLOSER TO PEOPLE'S LIVES.

MISSION

The Mission

Present and celebrate outcomes of a collaborative process linking science, art, and community engagement around soil health and biodiversity. The interaction was designed as both an exhibition of artworks and an interactive learning experience.



Location

Urdaibai Biosphere Reserve and Bilbao, Spain



Duration

One month exhibition following collaborative creation process

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THE CREATIVE PROCESS





Field Immersion

Students visited Urdaibai to observe biodiversity indicators: dragonflies, beetles, butterflies, migratory birds, and soil organisms like mycelium networks.



Documentation

Students captured textures, colors, and forms through photographs, sketches, and notes as creative inspiration.





Artistic Creation

Teams created thematic artworks using multiple techniques: graphite, ink, mixed media, acrylics, oils, watercolors, and natural pigments.

Exhibition

Final artworks displayed at BBF Bilbao for one month, attracting hundreds of visitors.





FIELD INMERSION

Contact with UPV teachers to bring art students to Urdaibai and present them iCOSHELLs, soil health and biodiversity

Dragonflies

Representing water quality and ecological balance



Beetles

Symbolizing habitat health and environmental sensitivity

Reflecting habitat connectivity and seasonal patterns

Each student team focused on one ecological indicator, creating detailed anatomical studies and abstract compositions that combined realism with symbolic expression.

to be exhibited. Soundscape is created.























ARTISTIC CREATION


















THE EXHIBITION EXPERIENCE

OPENING EVENT -JUNE 18, 2025

The exhibition opened at BBF Bilbao with representatives from the Basque Soil Living Lab introducing the connection to the EU's Mission Soil. Round table discussions featured experts, local stakeholders, and student-artists sharing their experiences.

Pedagogy students presented a unique auditory art piece — a soundscape capturing Urdaibai's natural sounds, translating ecological richness into an immersive sensory experience.

VISITOR ENGAGEMENT

Visitors walked through thematic zones representing the soil biodiversity story, listened to the soundscape, and interacted with artists. The exhibition became a shared space for reflection and co-learning.

Hundreds of visitors engaged during the onemonth display period, discussing links between soil, biodiversity, and community well-being.
